



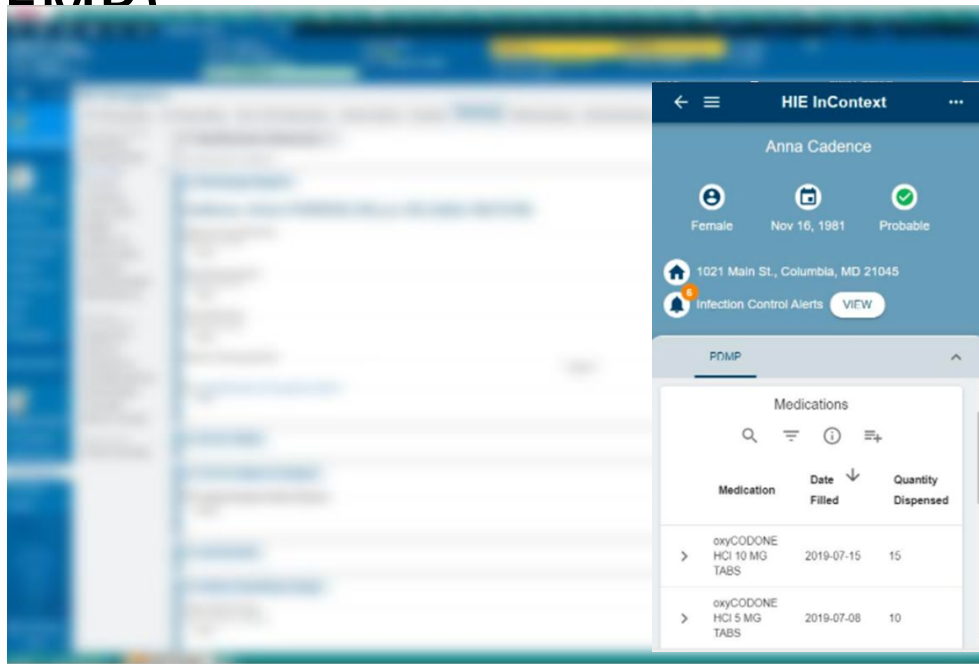

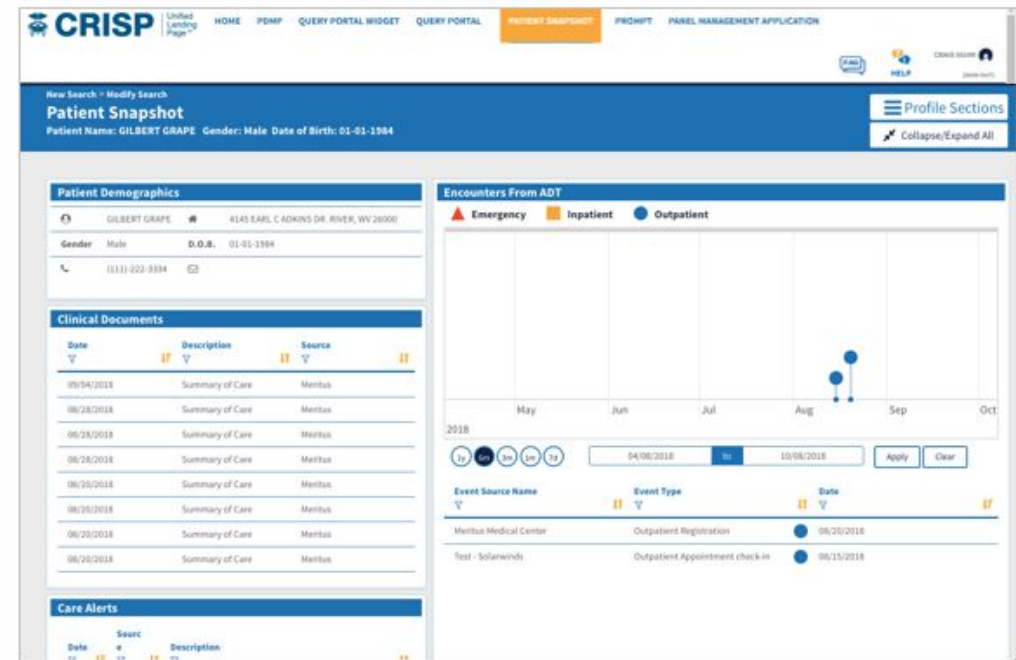


# How does User Access CRISP at the Point of Care?

# In-Context (SSO) Access to Advance Directives (1)

**Step 1: Provider opens EHR to patient chart**

- App can be configured to be always available (shown on right side of screen)
- App can launch on the click of a button

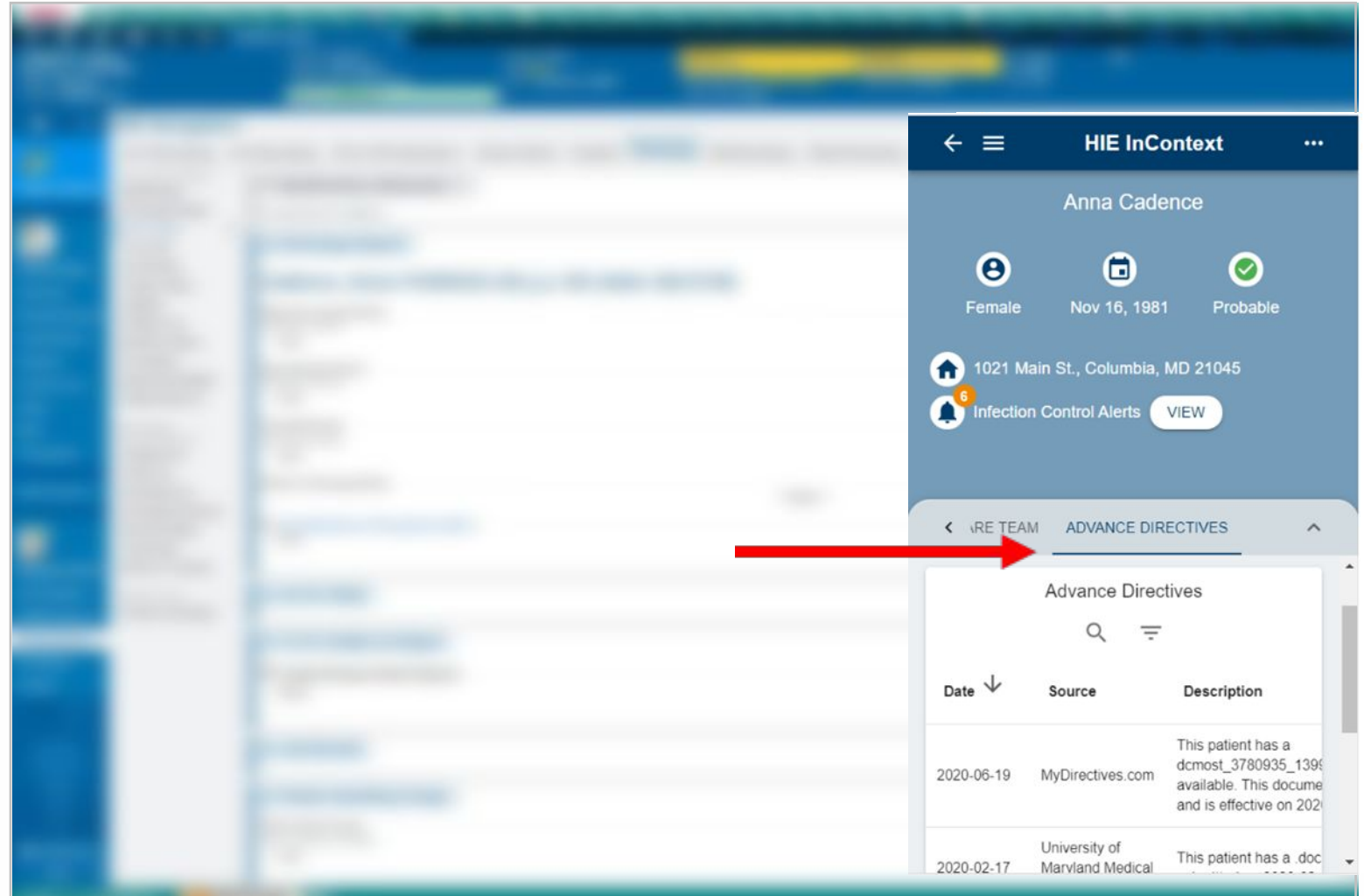

- PDMP for eligible users
- Overdose Events
- Care Alerts
- Prior Visits
- Care Teams and Programs
- **Advance Directives**

**Step 3: User clicks “Advance Directives” tab**

**Step 4: Tab expands to notify user if patient has electronic AD on file with ADVault**
